





### **Important Information**

- •For the third week, all markers of influenza activity (laboratory, reported cases, ER visits) increased in Los Angeles
- •Three times as many flu isolates have been recorded this year versus all of last year.

#### Influenza Activity: CA & USA

California: During week 4 (1/20/08-1/26/08), influenza activity in California was Regional. ILI admissions increased in Northern and Southern California and so prescriptions for antivirals. For more information see the CA influenza report: www.dhs.ca.gov/ps/dcdc/VRDL/html/FLU/Fluintro.htm

**United States:** The level of influenza activity increased throughout the US during week 4 (1/20/08-1/26/08). 11 states reported widespread influenza.
