Flu is a serious disease

- Flu can cause serious health problems that can lead to hospital stays or even death.



- Flu vaccines are recommended for everyone six months of age or older, including healthy adults. It's especially important to get a flu vaccine if you are:
 - 6 months through 18 years old
 - 50 years or older
 - Pregnant or just had a baby
 - Morbidly obese
 - A healthcare provider
 - Living in a nursing or long-term care home
 - Living with a weakened immune system or chronic medical condition (like diabetes, heart disease, or lung disease)
 - Living with or caring for someone
 - Under 5 years old
 - 50 years or older
 - With a chronic medical condition



Vaccines protect everyone

- Vaccines prepare our bodies to fight against disease. Getting vaccinated is the best way to prevent the flu and keep from spreading it to others.
- Get your flu vaccine in nasal spray or injection form to protect yourself and your community from the flu.
- Get your flu vaccine if you're pregnant or breastfeeding because you can then give protection against flu (immunity) to your baby.



Flu vaccines are safe

- Flu vaccines don't cause the flu.
- Both nasal spray and injection flu vaccines have to meet high levels of safety because they're given to millions of people each year.
- All flu vaccines are tested and tracked to assure quality, and monitor safety.
