2024-2025 COVID-19 Vaccine Recommendations

CDC recommends everyone ages 6 months and older receive an updated 2024-2025 COVID-19 vaccine to protect against the potentially serious outcomes of COVID-19 this fall and winter whether or not they have ever previously been vaccinated with a COVID-19 vaccine





Important 2024-2025 COVID-19 Vaccine Details


Updated COVID-19 vaccines will be available from Moderna, Pfizer and Novavax later this year

Clinical considerations and guidance will be forthcoming

It is safe to receive COVID-19 and flu vaccine at the same visit




Prospective 2024-2025 COVID-19 Vaccine Timeline

Addressing Billing & Reimbursement Challenges for COVID-19 Vaccine



Barriers for Facilities

LTC facilities have reported experiencing barriers to billing and reimbursement for administering COVID-19 vaccines for their patients/residents

- Confusion around when LTC pharmacies can and cannot bill directly
- Confusion around the type of coverage a resident has
- Challenges with understanding Medicare coverage



COVID-19 Vaccine Coverage

- Medicare, Medicaid (Medi-Cal) and most private health insurance plans cover COVID-19 vaccination without cost sharing
- Medicare
 - Part A: hospital insurance
 - Part B: medical insurance





Medicare Coverage

- For SNF residents, vaccine payment depends on
 - Type of vaccine (some covered by Part B, others by Part D)
 - If patient is using Part A coverage
- Part B covers COVID-19 vaccines with no cost sharing
- Vaccine can be billed by facility or LTC pharmacy, depending on whether patient is in Part A stay



Billing Flexibility – Part A Stay (includes hospice)

NURSING HOME MANAGED

Nursing home utilizes house stock vaccine or orders single dose vaccine from pharmacy, administers vaccine and charts vaccination.⁴



PHARMACY MANAGED

Nursing home (NH) orders vaccine from pharmacy who delivers and administers vaccine and reports to state IIS system.



Nursing Roster Bills Medicare Part B ⁵ Reports to NHSN. NH pays pharmacy for product and pays pharmacy for administration. ⁶



Billing Flexibility – Non-Part A Stay

NURSING HOME MANAGED

Nursing home utilizes house stock vaccine or orders single dose vaccine from pharmacy, administers vaccine and charts vaccination.⁴

Nursing Roster Bills Medicare Part B⁵ Reports to NHSN.

PHARMACY MANAGED

Nursing Home (NH)
orders single dose
vaccine and receives
from pharmacy.
Pharmacy, nursing staff
or contractor
administers.

Pharmacy Roster Bills Medicare Part B⁵ and passes administration fee to nursing home or contracted agent.⁶ Pharmacy reports to state IIS system. NH reports to NHSN.




Medicare Advantage Plans

Medicare Advantage is also known as Medicare Part C

Coverage would be subject to requirements of the patient's

managed care plan (in-network)

Check with plan for coverage details





Medi-Cal Coverage

- COVID-19 vaccines are covered by Medi-Cal
- Administration fee is reimbursable as a medical benefit
- Providers must procure vaccine (also a reimbursable cost)
- DHCS has noted they will continue to carve out the cost of COVID-19 vaccines and associated administration fees from the Medi-Cal managed care delivery system and will reimburse providers under Medi-Cal fee-for-service (until at least 12/31/24)*
