



Outbreak Criteria and Reporting Requirements for Communicable Diseases Common Among Children

To report suspected outbreaks or other <u>reportable diseases</u>, contact the Communicable **Disease Reporting System** by calling (888) 397-3993 or (213) 240-7821.

Disease	Outbreak Criteria You <u>must</u> report an outbreak if the following criteria are met:
Acute Respiratory Diseases (COVID-19, Influenza, RSV, etc.)	 In an epidemiologically linked group (e.g., classroom, sports team), a minimum of 5* cases (or 20% of the group) meet case definition for acute respiratory illness within a 7-day period, OR Across the facility (e.g., entire school), at least 10% of average daily attendance are absent or showing symptoms of acute respiratory illness, with a minimum of 5* individuals ill, within a 3-day span. *For groups smaller than 15, the minimum is reduced to 3 cases.
Conjunctivitis	 Minimum of 5 confirmed or suspected cases with symptoms consistent with conjunctivitis occurring within 3 to 5 days and within an epidemiologically linked group.
Diarrheal Diseases (including Norovirus and other unknown etiologies)	 Minimum of 3 cases or suspected cases with symptoms consistent with norovirus occurring within 3 to 5 days and within an epidemiologically linked group.
Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD)	 Minimum of 5* confirmed cases or suspected cases with symptoms consistent with HFMD occurring within 3 to 5 days and within an epidemiologically linked group. *For groups smaller than 15, the minimum is reduced to 3 cases.
Head Lice	Minimum of 5 cases in an epidemiologically linked group.
Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus (MRSA)	Minimum of 3 cases or suspected cases with symptoms consistent with MRSA occurring within 3 to 5 days and within an epidemiologically linked group.
Pertussis (Whooping Cough)	 The outbreak definition can vary. All known or suspected individual cases should be reported to LAC DPH.
Varicella (Chickenpox)	 Generally, an outbreak is defined as three or more epi-linked cases within a 3-week period. However, if there is exposure among a group at high risk for complications (immunocompromised or susceptible groups), the threshold may be lower.
