3. Confirm the diagnosis with proper testing including cultures, serology and antigen detection.
4. Identify appropriate therapy based on the patient's clinical presentation.
5. Identify high risk work-related activities associated with occupational coccidioidomycosis.
6. Describe the symptoms of Valley Fever in pets.
