



# COVID-19 Vaccine – Additional Doses and Booster Doses

**PEOPLE WHO HAVE A MODERATELY TO SEVERELY WEAKENED IMMUNE SYSTEM  
WHO HAVE ALREADY RECEIVED  
2 DOSES OF PFIZER OR MODERNA VACCINE**

If you meet the [criteria](#) outlined by the CDC below, it is recommended that you get a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of an mRNA (Pfizer or Moderna) vaccine at least 28 days after your 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of vaccine. When possible, you should receive the same vaccine. For example, if you got a series of Pfizer vaccine, try to get a Pfizer vaccine for your 3<sup>rd</sup> dose.

**Talk to your doctor about the need to get an additional dose of COVID-19 vaccine. If you need a 3rd dose, ask about the best timing based on your current treatment plan.** This is especially important if you are about to start or restart immunosuppressive treatment.

**I attest that I am immunocompromised and am eligible for a third dose of vaccine based on the criteria below.**

- I received a second dose of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine at least 28 days ago, AND
- I am:
  - Receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood, OR
  - Received an organ transplant and am taking medicine to suppress my immune system, OR
  - Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or am taking medicine to suppress the immune system, OR
  - Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome), OR
  - Advanced or untreated HIV infection, OR
  - Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that suppress my immune response

It is important to continue to protect yourself after you get a 3<sup>rd</sup> dose of vaccine. This includes wearing a well-fitting mask, maintaining physical distance, avoiding crowded places or spaces with poor air flow, and washing hands often. Consider "[double masking](#)" (wearing a cloth face mask over surgical mask) or an N95 respirator for a higher level of protection.

### PEOPLE WHO ARE ELIGIBLE FOR A BOOSTER DOSE

**I attest that I am eligible for a booster dose of vaccine based on the criteria below.**

- I received a J&J dose as my initial COVID-19 dose at least 2 months ago. **OR**
- I received a second dose of Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 6 months ago, **AND**
  - I am age 65 years or older, **OR**
  - I live in a long-term care setting, **OR**
  - I am age 50–64 years and experience social and economic risks that place me at increased risk for COVID-19, **OR**
  - I am age 18-64 and I have an underlying health condition that increases my risk for severe disease from COVID **OR**
  - I am age 18-64 years and am at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because I live in an institutional setting, or because I [work](#) in a place where there is risk for exposure to the virus; this includes but is not limited to the following:
