

A TRAINING FOR PERSONNEL FROM TRAUMA CENTERS, EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS, AND PRIMARY CARE SETTINGS

SCREENING, BRIEF INTERVENTION, AND REFERRAL TO TREATMENT

UCLA Integrated Substance Abuse Programs (UCLA-ISAP) and California Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP) are conducting a series of day-long workshops to enhance skills to conduct screening, brief intervention and referral to treatment (SBIRT) for alcohol and other drug problems with patients in trauma centers, emergency departments and primary health care settings. Screening and brief intervention have been shown to reduce future reinjury and/or rehospitalization.

The goal of this training is to teach providers how to screen their patients for alcohol and other drug problems using effective and validated strategies and develop skills for conducting a brief intervention for those who screen positive. For those in need of treatment for addictive disorders, brief intervention can also help the patient to understand the need for and accept a referral for addiction treatment.

Trainings will be offered across the state during the Spring and Fall 2009.
