Webinar Overview

Increases in female syphilis cases have led to a dramatic increase of congenital syphilis cases in Los Angeles County with a total of 24 cases in 2016 to an anticipated 43 cases in 2017. This webinar reviews epidemiologic trends in syphilis in women and congenital syphilis in California. It also provides information on syphilis screening recommendations, clinical manifestations, diagnostic approaches, staging, and treatment options for women. Characteristics of congenital syphilis cases are discussed as well as opportunities for prevention.
