It's Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM)! It's hard to believe it is October and that we have been through six months of this overwhelming pandemic. Thanks to all of you for your amazing work, collaboration and the generosity of heart and spirit that you have shown and shared since this started. We are getting through this together. I am looking forward to the day that we can safely meet in person. For now, I want to share a couple of things that the DV Council is presenting (remotely) this month.

- **On October 15th from 2:00-4:00**, the Domestic Violence Council, the Domestic Violence Alliance, the County's Office of Violence Prevention, the Positive Results Center and Back to the Basics will be hosting our first conversation about the Los Angeles Domestic Violence Community Supporting the Black/African American Community. The conversation, "**Survivors and Services: Discussing Support for Black/ African American Communities**" will include an amazing panel including Karen Earl (Jenesse Center); Kande Lewis (Positive Results Center); Tara Peterson (Glendale YWCA); Sharon Shelton (YWCA Greater LA) and Bernita Walker (Project Peacemakers). The panel will be moderated by Kelli Dillon (Back to the Basics in collaboration with the Positive Results Center.) After answering some preliminary questions, the conversation will be opened up to the audience to ask questions and continue the conversation. We hope to host a series of conversations that will lead us to action steps that will improve services and support and bring our community together. A zoom link will be distributed shortly.
- **On October 20th from Noon to 2:00**, the DVC and the DVA will be hosting our **Annual Domestic Violence Awards Ceremony**. Please join us as we recognize and celebrate our colleagues who are being recognized for their outstanding contributions! A link to the meeting will be distributed shortly.
