LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

Remember that the Governor has until 9/30/24 to sign or veto bills. At this point in the legislative year, everything is either "dead," "enrolled" (passed out of legislature and pending on Governor's desk) or "chaptered" (signed by Governor as new state law).

For state updates, please check the bill chart.

Note that although AB1799 died, the Mandatory Reporting Task Force made recommendations that were adopted by the Child Welfare Council, and which includes the concepts from AB1799.

As to local City updates, there will be no DART report. CIFD's RFP was due on September 4 and they expect to have contracts in place for January 1. The Human Trafficking report is being written.

Nothing new from City Council

As far as County motions, all reports have been written, Solis' February motion being reviewed at LAHSA
