NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

Project Title: Identify in the Solid Waste Permit Facilities Permit (SWFP) the amount of inert material received for beneficial use at Savage Landfill

Project Location: Savage Canyon Landfill (SCLF), 13919 East Penn Street, Whittier, CA 90602
Solid Waste Information System No. 19-AH-0001

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The SCLF has been accepting clean dirt, asphalt concrete, and cement from construction projects within City limits prior to the issuance of the 1978 Solid Waste Facilities Permit by the Los Angeles County Local Enforcement Agency (LEA). On several occasions within the past 5 years, the SCLF received over 3,000 tons per day of inert material without incidents or environmental impacts. Although the receipt of inert debris in large quantities is expected only to occur during special circumstances, the SCLF is seeking approval from the LEA and the California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery to identify this amount in the SWFP. The inert material is used for daily operations such as cover, construction of internal access roads, winter operation pad and stockpiles for partial closure of the SCLF.

Reasons why project is exempt:

Since the receipt of inert debris materials greater than 3,000 tons per day has been the standard practice for many years at Savage Landfill without any incidents or complaints, it is not expected that any significant adverse environmental impacts may result by identifying the amount of 3,000 tons per day of inert debris in the SWFP. Therefore, based on the fact that this is an existing operation, the project is considered exempt from CEQA requirement.
