Summary

Healthcare providers will learn from Los Angeles County Department of Public Health Medical Epidemiologists who are part of the team overseeing the local response to Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The webinar will cover the epidemiology of COVID-19, current recommendations for the clinical evaluation of patients with suspect COVID-19 infection, and infection control and prevention. There will also be a live Q&A session.
