
# In the Spotlight - This is What it Takes! Public Awareness Campaign

The California Department of Public Health's Alzheimer's Disease Program recently launched California's first Alzheimer's disease public awareness media campaign "This is What it Takes!" The goals of this campaign are to 1) Increase awareness of Alzheimer's disease prevention measures, risk factors, and signs/symptoms; and 2) Shift public perceptions and reduce social stigma around Alzheimer's disease.

Target audience: Pre-symptomatic individuals, people living with the disease, and populations disproportionately impacted by Alzheimer's disease. This includes women, communities of color (including Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino, and Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander), and (LGBTQ)+ communities.
