

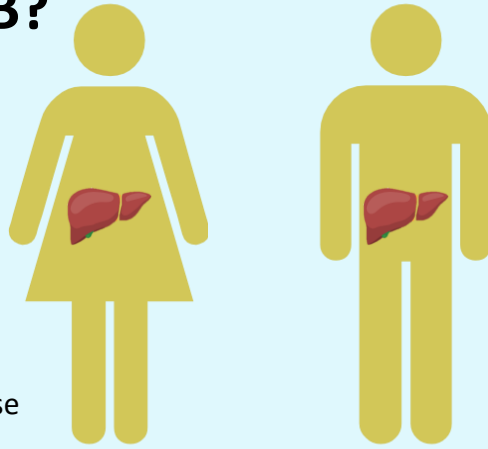
Get Tested for Hepatitis B

What is Hepatitis B?

Hepatitis B (hep B) is a liver disease caused by the hep B virus.

If a pregnant woman has hep B, the baby can get hep B during birth. All babies need to get shots to prevent hep B.

Hep B is the most common cause of liver cancer in the world.



You can get hep B through contact with an infected person's blood or body fluids.

Some people with hep B have no signs of disease.

You can prevent hep B by getting shots.

People born in Asia or people whose parents were born in Asia



All pregnant women

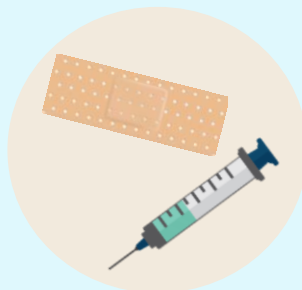


People who live with someone who has hep B

Why Should I Get Tested?



Getting a test is the only way to know if you have hep B.



If you do not have hep B, make sure to get the hep B shots.



If you have hep B, treatment can keep you healthy.

Living With Hepatitis B

I have hepatitis B (hep B).

What should I do?

Go to a doctor who treats hep B. Your doctor will determine what treatment you need. Treatment can help you stay healthy and reduce your risk of liver cancer.



How do I protect my family?



Your family members and sexual partners should talk to their doctor about hep B testing.

* If they have hep B they may need treatment.

* If they do not have hep B they need shots to prevent hep B.

How do I protect my baby?

Go to a doctor who treats hep B. Treatment can lower the chance your baby will get hep B during birth. After your baby is born, make sure they get all the hep B shots and tests they need.
