



Changing landscape for respiratory vaccines

- Before the COVID19 pandemic
- Years of frequent change
- Back to stability? Are we there yet?




Pharmacies remain a crucial part of the vaccine landscape

- Generally increased comfort and awareness of pharmacies as trusted providers for communitydwelling adults
- For residential care settings, continued barriers to onsite provision of vaccines without the assistance of pharmacy partners
- Unclear future of government funded support for coordination, education or vaccine provision in these settings

Events for seniors FY24 -25 by facility type



Elements has led 808 of 1,454 events in the 2024-2025 fiscal year, of which 83% took place in SNFs!

Introduction



Completing a clinic event at Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNFs) and Assisted Living Facilities (ALFs)

Phase 1: Preparation

• Items completed before the clinic

Phase 2: Administration

Execution of event/vaccination plan

Phase 3: Wrap-up

After the clinic — steps to mark event as completed



Phase 1: Preparation

1.

Obtain list of residents from facility or face sheets, & copies of completed consent forms.

Note: Elements has an optional service to obtain consent from residents in ALFs, while SNFs obtain consent for their residents.

3.

Verify **insurance** + determine which vaccines are **covered**.

2.

Create **vaccination plan** for residents (guided with CAIR).

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Consented for vaccines + any lingering issues for each resident are noted in the vaccination plan.



Phase 2: Administration

1.
Before starting any work at SNFs,
pharmacists review the daily
census and check on the stay
status of each resident.

2.

Pharmacists follow vaccination

plan for each resident and

vaccinate.

Clinics typically take **2-4 hours** depending on the size of the facility.

Note: To service new residents who do not already have a vaccination plan, vaccinators on site check CAIR in real-time; Community events also run this way, real-time.



Phase 3: Wrap-up

1.


Billing for all services **takes place** at the pharmacy.

2.

Dose information is reported to CAIR and to MVT team's database.

Field teams

- Field teams consist of 1-3 staff.
 - At Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNFs) teams usually consist of 1-2 pharmacists.
 - At assisted living facilities, teams include an additional person to support with crowd control.

Behind the Scenes

Outreach

- Mass emails with the goal of educating, updating, and informing the facilities
- Regular check-in calls that serve to remind partners about their free services or to follow-up to get them on their calendar
- Attending conferences and tabling at events



Behind the Scenes

Staffing

- Element's workforce:
 - Made up of part-time, full-time, and contracted pharmacists
- To staff mobile clinics:
 - Elements pulls from all of its available workforce
 - There are between 10-20 staff involved in mobile clinics



Insurance and vaccine coverage

Insurance Type	Covers
Medi-Cal	Usually covers all vaccines
Medicare Part B	COVID-19, Pneumonia, Flu, Hepatitis B*, Tdap*
Medicare Part D	RSV, Hepatitis B*, Tdap*, & other recommendations from the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)
Private Insurance	Coverage varies by insurance

^{*}Medicare part A, B or D depending on a person's circumstances



Insurance and vaccine coverage: key points

- The billing process is similar for those with Medi-Cal, Medicare part D, private insurance, and patients with dual Medicare and Medi-Cal
- Billing for those with Medicare part B is different because it cannot be billed in real time.
 - Benefits needs to be verified first and claims are uploaded later
- Skilled-Nursing Facilities (SNFs) have patients on a long-term stay or a short term-stay.
 - Short-term stay patients go through a process called "consolidated billing", where SNFs must be the ones completing the billing for Medicare part B covered vaccinations (except COVID-19 until 2029) for patients under this stay.
 - If a pharmacy ends up vaccinating and billing, Medicare will request the money back.

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Barriers

Administered vaccines
by other entities
(private providers, SNFs,
etc). are not always
reflected on CAIR.

Turnover in nursing homes; the IP nurse staff turns over a lot.

Cold calling is hard, establishing new relationships is a challenge.

Insurance covers the vaccines and their administration but not time.
