Course Description:

This CME event will provide current information on the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) Recommended Immunization Schedules for Persons Aged 0 Through 18 Years *and* Adults Aged 19 Years and Older — United States, 2013. The course will enhance the participant’s knowledge of immunization recommendations to increase vaccine coverage levels and prevent vaccine-preventable diseases in children and adults in Los Angeles County.

Educational Objectives: At the conclusion of the lecture, participants will be able to:

1. Determine the most appropriate schedule to use when evaluating a child’s immunization status.
2. Discuss the new recommendations for use of Tdap in pregnant women.
3. State the correct interval when 2 live vaccines are not administered on the same day.
4. State two key messages for dealing with vaccine-hesitant parents.
5. Explain two configurations used to interpret the immunization recommendations on the 2013 adult schedule.
6. State three major high-risk medical indications for adult vaccine administration.
7. List two major reasons Healthcare Personnel (HCP) are recommended for vaccination.
8. Identify two primary indications for immunizing ethnically diverse adults, age 19 years and older in LA County.

Learning Formats: Educational methods will include lecture, power-point presentation, questions, answers and discussion.

Target Audience: This activity is applicable for Physicians. Other groups who are encouraged to participate include Nurses, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, DoD paraprofessionals, Pharmacists, Epidemiologists, Public Health Investigators, Health Educators, and Community Health Workers.
