A new Coordinator has been identified and will start on June 5, 2017 • One of the new Coordinator’s priorities will be to assess Coalition satisfaction and update the ACLAC Strategic Plan (Expires in 2017) <p><u>Policy Updates:</u></p> <p><i>AB391 Chiu-San Francisco:</i> Increases the access for Medi-Cal beneficiaries to asthma education</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legislation that has to pass to authorize DHCS to submit the state plan amendment <p>The bill successfully passed out of the Assembly Health committee with bipartisan support and an 11-0 vote on April 18th. Next, the bill will be heard in the Assembly Appropriations Committee near the end of May.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coalition members were strongly encouraged to submit a letter of support for AB391. <p>Community Action to Fight Asthma (CAFA) Policy Agenda Review</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Janet reviewed the various bills that are on the CAFA legislative agenda. <p>Outdoor Air Pollution and Stressful Family Environments” Dr. Ted Robles, UCLA</p>	<p>Ted Robles presented an observational study identifying stress triggers that influence the health of families and the connection to asthma triggers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The grant proposal to be submitted to NIH in June 2017 • Dr. Ted Robles touched on the combined effects on asthma outcomes and bio-behavioral mechanisms, including <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ High outdoor air pollution ○ Stressful family environments <p>Study will follow a child throughout a year to monitor asthma outcomes via 3-week brief daily questionnaires, electronic inhaler, and sleep monitoring.</p> <p>Ted is seeking community partners and reached out to coalitions members for potential partnership or participation in the community advisory board. 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<p>Presentation: How the new administration will impact our local work on healthcare immigration and civil rights</p> <p>Dr. Miriam Vega, CEO, UMMA Community Clinic</p>	<p>United Muslim Medical Association (UMMA) Community Health Clinic- Established in 1992 by medical students from UCLA & Charles Drew University in the wake of the LA riots</p> <p>Dr. Vega presented on the 3 areas on healthcare, immigration, and civil rights.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase in anxiety causing hesitation to seek healthcare needs (Immigration) • Residents are reluctant to call police and fire department because they are afraid of ICE. • UMMA Clinic 75% of patients are Latino, putting a concern on civil rights and immigration <p>Deportation of illegal immigrants is impacting residents by deferring them from seeking public assistance and healthcare services.</p> <p>Travel ban: Refugees- No significant impact on clinics</p> <p>Resulting Community Trauma: PTSD→Stress→Stigma</p> <p>What is UMMA doing?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patients <p>Red Alert cards that provide patients with their rights that can be shown to police officers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • With our staff • Infrastructure <p>Advocacy plan-Many individuals 60% have experienced a similar event resulting in a 20% decrease in life and increase in suicide</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UMMA screens for this events to address this trauma at a young age • ICE protocols =warrants, role playing to familiarize staff • Does not collect document data <p>New partnerships/collaborations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal Aid partnerships/media • Attending immigration related community/town hall meetings <p>Advocacy Plan:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Making Advocacy an Organizational Priority • Operationalizing Advocacy • Defining and Refining our Narrative • Engaging the Community in Advocacy • Reporting, Revisions & Status Updates 	<p>slate of nominees was approved.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Vega recommended ACESTOOHIGH.COM, a news site reporting on adverse childhood experiences and organizational adaptation to changing social factors. <p>Contact Information: Dr. Miriam Vega, CEO, UMMA Community Clinic mvega@ummaclinic.org</p>
