	 Pest Infestations (IAQ WG) – CA Healthy Housing Coalition has identified and 	
	developed two policies that they are trying to get introduced into legislation	
	this year: (1) Expand enforcement authority - Current health and safety code	
	limits ability to enforce pest infestation so local city agencies don't have the	
	authority to enforce. Brandon said this is more of an issue outside of LA County	
	(ex. San Diego). CAFA is trying to modify the language in this code to expand the	

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	 language to cover this issue when set agreements are not established in a jurisdiction. (2) Increase the use of integrated pest management in rental housing – often the solution used to address pest infestation (ex. Aerosols, foggers) can have respiratory health impacts. Tenants don't currently have a choice of what their landlords use. Proposed new policy would offer tenants a three-bar choice ranging from addressing pest elimination to addressing the structural issues contributing to pest infestation. School Facilities (Schools WG) – The current School Facilities Bond allocates money for new schools construction, rather than for existing schools. They are advocating for more funding for existing schools. Current funding has been given on first-come, first-serve basis. No measure of need is included and no assessment. Therefore the schools in most need are less likely to be able to getting matching funds to submit bids. The proposed new school facilities bond would include an assessment to determine need so more money would go towards existing structures and existing structures in most need. Next school bond wouldn't go on the ballot until 2014. Preliminary work is happening at the State Allocation Board and Assembly Education Committee. CAFA is working with them to determine timeline – June or November 2014 ballot measure. Single Payer Health Care (Clinical WG) – Senator Leno (Bay Area) is advocating for single payer health care system to expand coverage for all Californians. It will remain SB 810. 	
Presentation: "Results from the Asthma Action Plan (AAP) Survey with School Nurses"	 Purpose: Disseminate and increase use of AAPs in schools. Reviewed the AAP results from 2012. There is not a nurse for every school – one nurse may respond for 4 schools, for example. School nurses cannot complete AAPs for students themselves because they have to be completed by a doctor or nurse practitioner. AAPs can be confused by families for a prescription (rather than an AAP). Will continue to do the AAP survey annually. Next year will report for all three past years to see any changes/trends in data. There have not been significant cuts of PE teachers in schools.
