Suggestion for the SC to draft a policy statement on ACLAC's position on a unified AAP form for use in primary care in LA County. Need to find out who at DHS is working on the AAP form. The ACLAC should provide TA to groups in LA County about the components/standards that need to be included in an AAP form from a school perspective. Francisco reviewed the IAQ strategies. The workgroup will start working on the Work Plan at their next meeting on Wednesday, August 21 st . SJWCFC met with housing inspectors to discuss strategy 1 (recommendations for improvement of housing inspections). SB 488 (pest infestations) passed this week. Feedback & recommendations for data & content	 Amy Lightstone from the DPH Office of Health Assessment & Epidemiology reviewed the LA County Health Survey data. The data includes both adult and child components (adult as proxy to answer questions about the child). DPH works to disseminate the data throughout LA, including through the LA Health Brief. ACLAC's components of the Asthma Brief would include the introduction, recommendations, and highlights. Available data to include in the brief include prevalence of asthma and activity limitation, missed school/daycare days due to asthma, take medications and ER visits due to asthma, and possibly insurance status, regular source of care, etc. Can include both stable & unstable data in the brief, but must 	 Send the link to the LA County Health Survey to the SC. Cost data are needed to drive change (e.g. cost of missed school days). Use data to drive increased resource allocation to asthma (especially by the County/DPH). Use LAUSD cost estimates of missed school days. Need to use data to highlight disparities in asthma around the County (e.g. the Antelope Valley). Highlight physical activity limitations due to asthma and the link to childhood obesity. Possibility to translate the brief into Spanish, if necessary. Compare LA data to State data (Asthma Surveillance Report). Create virtual ad hoc committee to work on the Asthma Brief. Use Box.com or Dropbox to circulate the document. Volunteers include Janet, Dr. Vinetz, Dr. Takahashi (pending), Jessica, Katie, and Monica. 		
CMS Medicaid Regulations & ACLAC Actions • Description of recent changes • Discussion of potential actions	 Dr. Vinetz reviewed the new CMS regulations regarding the Medicaid prevention rule and community-based services. This may have an impact on CHWs and other non-physician staff to get reimbursed for asthma education & home visitation services. Next step is to educate legislators locally to get the State to act on these new regulations. Janet spoke with Cara Baldari from First Focus in Washington, DC who is doing research on this topic and would like to know what local coalitions plan to do. Need for direction from RAMP or CAFA to lead progress on this topic. RAMP will likely begin discussing a plan to give local coalitions actions to take to support the regulations. Monica and/or Jessica will provide updates from the calls to the SC. Next CAFA call is on August 27th. Other important partners may include BREATHE CA and ALA.
