



Los Angeles County VACCINATIONS FOR FOOD AND AGRICULTURAL WORKERS

The COVID-19 Vaccine is free to all eligible persons.

Immigration status and insurance are not required. Medical information is protected by law.

WHO CAN GET VACCINATED?

Those at risk of exposure at work (only on-site workers are eligible):

- Food service workers (including restaurants, cafeterias, fast food, convenience stores, animal/pet food stores, worker with a Food Cart/Street Vendor)
- Food delivery workers
- Food manufacturing workers
- Grocery store workers
- Pharmacy workers
- Animal agriculture workers including those involved in veterinary health
- Agricultural workers, including farmworkers, and their support service and supply workers, who are responsible for the planting, cultivating, growing, harvesting, and bringing to market any agricultural or horticultural commodity. (Includes non-edible plants and flowers)
- Veterinarians and animal care workers
- Food and Agriculture-associated port and transportation workers
- Workers involved with food supply chain
- Government/Food Assistance program worker (volunteers eligible if working more than 20 hours/week and have a letter from the employer certifying eligibility)
- Permitted catering company worker (not home-based)
- Private domestic workers, such as Gardeners, Landscape workers (must work more than 20 hours per week)

Exception: the following people are NOT eligible

- ✗ Equestrian center staff and horse groomers
- ✗ Pest control technicians for houses
- ✗ Home and garden store workers or suppliers
- ✗ General hotel workers (only eligible if work in restaurant or giftshop that sells food/beverage)
- ✗ Those working on landscaping service
- ✗ Anyone who buys or supports the sale of nursery stock from the original grower and is not employed by the original grower (e.g. florists, home garden stores etc.)

HOW DO THOSE IN FOOD AND AGRICULTURE GET VACCINATED?

Vaccines are available in many different locations:

- Albertsons, Vons, Pavilions, Costco, and Ralphs are offering vaccines to in-store, food distribution, and transport workers who are part of their grocery/pharmacy chains
- Mobile vaccinations clinics are offering vaccines in partnership with worker unions, community-based organizations, and trade associations
- Food and Agricultural businesses in the City of Vernon are being vaccinated at their workplace or in mobile units by Stacy Medical
- County-run MegaPODs (point of dispensing sites) or other large vaccination sites, pharmacies, hospitals, and community clinics are offering vaccine and are listed on [VaccinateLACounty.com](#). Residents with disabilities or





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without computer access can call 833-540-0473 between 8:00 am and 8:30 pm 7 days a week for assistance with appointments.

- Some healthcare providers are offering vaccine – find out if your provider has vaccine by viewing the [list](#) of facilities and providers on the VaccinateLACounty.com appointment page or contact your doctor.

WHAT DOCUMENTATION IS REQUIRED?

In order to be vaccinated, you must bring document(s) to show all 3 of the following:

- 1 **Photo ID** (does not have to be government issued), *and*
- 2 **Proof that you are a food or agricultural worker**, *and*
- 3 **Proof that you live or work in LA County**

Note: one document may cover more than one requirement e.g. if your paystub shows an address in LA County. *The lists below are not complete and other documents may be accepted.*

Proof that you are a food or agricultural worker

Bring one of the documents from the list below:

- Badge with your name and your employer’s name
- Paycheck stub with your name
- California Food Handler card
- Certified Food Protection Manager card
- Current food business operator permit
- Food Handler/Manager card with employer attestation (see below)
- Copy of work shift schedule with your name
- License (state veterinary medical license, registered veterinary technician, other state foodbusiness license)
- Letter from your employer which includes your name, and the name and address of the business (template to fill out on a [computer](#) or by [hand](#))
- Attestation from you which includes your name, your job title, and the name and address of the business (Templates available: [English](#), [Español](#), [简体中文](#), [العربية](#), [հայերեն](#), [မြန်မာစာ](#), [한국어](#), [Русский](#), [Tiếng Việt](#), [فارسی](#), [Tagalog](#), [日本語](#), [繁體中文](#). If you do not have access to a printer, it can be written by hand.)
- Letter from your Union which includes your name, and the name the name and address of the business (template to fill out on a [computer](#) or by [hand](#))
- Letter or attendance sheet from an agency/community-based organization that coordinates day-laborers for work in Food and Agriculture

Proof that you live in LA County (must show your name and address):

Examples include:

- Driver’s license
- California ID card or REAL ID card (from the DMV)
- Library card
- Post-marked letter
- Utility bill
- Vehicle registration
- Vehicle insurance
- Voter registration confirmation





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- Rent receipt or lease or letter from landlord
- School or employment document
- Court document
- Law enforcement document (can be from immigration including deportation)
- Tax, bank, or insurance document
- Post Office change of address confirmation
- Letter or document from a Faith-based organization, shelter, non-profit institution with the name/address of issuing organization
- Membership card – YMCA, store club card, fitness center, community or neighborhood association, apartment building association
- Consular ID
- My Health LA ID card (this is acceptable even though it does not show your address because the card is only issued to people who live in LA County)

Second dose: White vaccine record or electronic vaccine record card AND a photo ID.
