The CalFresh Healthy Living grantees are funded through March 31, 2020 to reduce the prevalence of obesity and chronic disease among low-income Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Education (SNAP-Ed) eligible populations. Grantees will implement nutrition education, physical activity promotion, and work to create healthier environments for low-income individuals and families where they live, learn, work, play, pray, and shop.
