Public Health Nurse

POSITION INFORMATION:

The PHN functions under the direction of a Public Health Nurse Supervisor and the Nurse Manager in the Case Management Unit.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- A license to practice as a Registered Nurse and a Public Health Nurse certificate issued by the California Board of Registered Nursing, and a California Class C Driver License.
- Must currently hold the payroll title of Public Health Nurse or be reachable on PHN list.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:

- Public Health Nursing field experience
- Effective problem solving and analytical skills
- Outstanding written and verbal communication skills
- Previous experience developing and conducting presentations
- Strong organization and customer Service skills
- Ability to create an action plan and prioritize duties
- Ability to perform effectively and independently
- Computer skills: MS Word, MS Excel, MS Power Point
- Bilingual, English-Spanish, skills preferred

EXAMPLE OF DUTIES:

- Case management of lead poisoned children within an assigned geographical area
- Detailed assessment to gather pertinent information necessary to identify possible source of exposure, provide health teaching on lead awareness to client, family and community
- Make home, medical provider, hospital and juvenile confinement visits to interview and gather pertinent patient information necessary to assess the health status and needs of individuals and families
- Develop individual service plans, providing anticipatory guidance and referral to community resources and social service agencies
- Interpret diagnostic procedures such as blood lead level, hemoglobin and hematocrit values, and immunizations to determine solutions for abnormal values and update immunization records
- Collaborate with health programs, health departments, and community organizations/agencies that interface with health care providers to ensure that providers are aware of their legal responsibilities with respect to lead screening guidelines, counseling on how to avoid lead poisoning, and of available case management services
- Participate in the Medi-Cal Lead Program Time Study, and outreach activities to assess, counsel, and teach individuals, families, and communities concerning lead prevention, lead-safe work practices, healthy habits, health promotion and disease prevention
